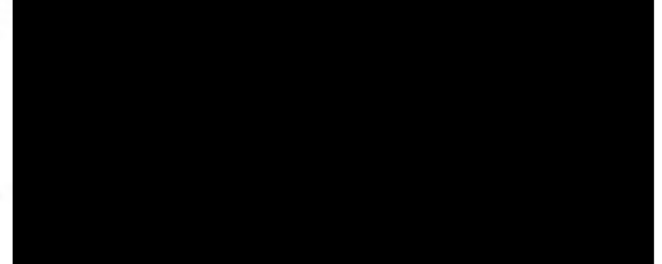

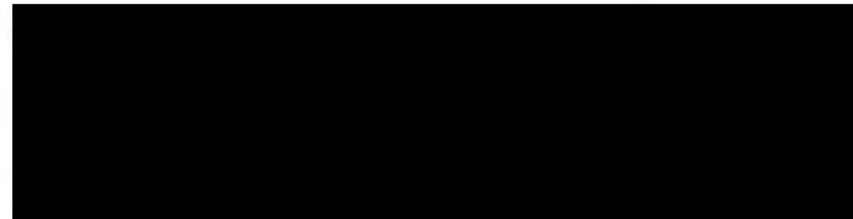
**10-year Fracture Risk:**

FRAX not reported because:  
Treated for osteoporosis

**Impression:** The patient has low bone mass, based on the Total Spine T-score.

**Discussion:** It is important to ask patients whether they are taking their medications and to encourage continued and appropriate compliance with their osteoporosis therapies to reduce fracture risk. It is also important to review their risk factors and encourage appropriate calcium and vitamin D intakes, exercise, fall prevention and other lifestyle measures.

**Follow-Up:** Consider a repeat BMD and Vertebral Fracture Assessment (VFA) exam in 2 years or sooner if medically necessary, to reassess this patient's status.
